



## “Moral Corruption”

*Failure of the Flesh*  
*Exodus 32:10-25*

*Corruption is the result of the failure of :*

### I. **Love** – “Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel” (vs. 10-14)

*Being conscious of the:*

- A. **P**\_\_\_\_\_ - “with great power, and with a mighty hand”
- B. **Pr**\_\_\_\_\_ - “Wherefore should the Egyptians speak”
- C. **Pro**\_\_\_\_\_ - “to whom thou sware by thine own self”

### II. **Law** – “the two tables of the testimony” (vs. 15-20)

*Being confident that it is:*

- A. **Suf**\_\_\_\_\_ - “written on both sides”
- B. **Su**\_\_\_\_\_ - “the tables were the work of God”
- C. **S**\_\_\_\_\_ - “the writing was the writing of God”

### III. **Leadership** – “thou has brought...sin upon them” (vs. 21-25)

*Being careful not to:*

- A. **ame** - “thou knowest the people...set on mischief”
- B. **ame** - “I cast it in the fire...there came out this calf”
- C. **ame** - “Aaron had made them naked unto their shame”
