I. Complaining – “God was not well pleased” (vs. 1-5)

They murmur about God’s:

- C. *Pro* _____ – “did all eat the same spiritual meat”

II. Craving – “should not lust after evil things” (vs. 6-10)

Their desires are :

- A. *Id* _____ – “Neither be ye idolaters, as were some of them”
- B. *Im* _____ – “Neither let us commit fornication”
- C. *In* _____ – “Neither murmur ye, as some of them”

III. Conceit - “him that thinks he stands” (vs. 11-13)

They don’t heed the:

- A. *Ex* _____ – “things happened unto them for our ensamples”
- B. *Ex* _____ – “written for our admonition”
- C. *Es* _____ – “also make a way to escape”
