## We have a lack of:

I. **R**espect – "Honor thy father and thy mother" (vs.16-21)

It's seen in our:

- A. T\_\_\_\_\_- "Thou shall not kill"
- **B.** Ta\_\_\_\_\_ "Neither shall thou steal"
- C. Tal\_\_\_\_\_ "shall you bear false witness against thy neighbor"

**II. R**everence – "showed us His glory...His greatness"(vs. 22-27) *It's in spite of His:* 

A. P\_\_\_\_\_\_- - "who is there of all flesh that has heard the voice"

**B. Pr**\_\_\_\_-"Go thou near, and hear all that the Lord...shall say"

C. Pro\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ – "God shall speak...we will hear it and do it"

III. Righteousness – "keep my commandments" (vs. 28-33) It's a matter of:

- A. Si\_\_\_\_\_\_ "O that there were such a heart in them"
- **B.** Sa\_\_\_\_\_\_ "that it may be well with them...for ever"

*C. Su*\_\_\_\_\_-"that ye may live , and that it may be well with thee"
