II. Servants –“Eleazar...ministered in the priest’s office” (vs. 6-9)

His servants are:

- A. **Une**_____ - “there Aaron died and there he was buried”
- B. **Unf**_____ – “At that time the Lord separated the tribe of Levi”
- C. **Une**_____ – “Levi hath no part nor inheritance”

III. Steadfastness – “hearkened at that time also” (vs. 10-11)

His steadfastness seen in His:

- A. **For**_____ - “forty days and forty nights the Lord hearkened”
- B. **Fo**_____ – “the Lord would not destroy thee”
- C. **F**_____ – “which I swear to their fathers to give to them”
