God ordains:

I. Judges – “Judges and officers shall you make” (vs. 18-19)

Justice without:

- A. **P** _____ – “thou shall not wrest judgment”
- B. **Pa** _____ – “thou shall not respect persons”
- C. **Pay** _____ - “neither take a gift”

II. Justice – “that which is altogether just” (v. 20)

Justice leads to:

- A. **P** _____ - “which is altogether just shall thou follow”
- B. **Pr** _____ – “that thou may live”
- C. **Pro** _____ – “inherit the land which the Lord thy God gives you”

III. Judgement – “which the Lord thy God hates” (vs. 21-22, 1)

Justice that confronts:

- A. **Im** _____ – “You shall not plant thee a grove of any trees”
- B. **Im** _____ – “Neither shall you set thee up any image”
- C. **Im** _____ – “wherein is blemish, or any evilfavoredness”
