II. Remain – "of whom are Phygellus and Hermogenes" (v. 15)		
Remaining is often:

B. Unp – "that all they which are in Asia be"		
<i>C</i> .	Unr – "turned away from me"	
III. $Refresh$ – "refreshed me and was not ashamed" (vs. 16-18)		
Refreshing requires:
