- A. **R**_____ – “For since by a man came death”

- C. **Ref**_____ – “in Christ all will be made alive”

II. Succession - “But each in his own order” (vs. 23-24)

The Succession of the:

- A. **So**_____ – “Christ the first fruits”
- B. **Sa**_____ – “after that those who are Christ’s at His coming”
- C. **So**_____ – “then...He hands over the kingdom to the... Father”

III. Subjection – “that God may be all in all” (vs. 25-28)

The Subjection is for:

- A. **E**_____ - “until He has put all His enemies under His feet”
- B. **E**_____ – “He has put all things in subjection under His feet”
- C. **E**_____ – “the Son Himself also will be subjected to Him”
