



## “Rebellion”

*Unyielded to God  
Deuteronomy 1:19-33*

### **Yielding to:**

#### **I. Disbelief** – “which the Lord our God does give to us” (vs. 19-25)

*Discounting God’s:*

- A. **Gra** \_\_\_\_\_ - “God has set the land before thee”
- B. **Gr** \_\_\_\_\_ – “brings us word again by what way we must go”
- C. **G** \_\_\_\_\_ – “It is a good land which the Lord...give us”

#### **II. Disobedience** - “but rebelled against the...Lord” (vs. 26-29)

*Denying God’s:*

- A. **L** \_\_\_\_\_ - “Notwithstanding you would not go up”
- B. **Lo** \_\_\_\_\_ – “Because the Lord hated us”
- C. **Lor** \_\_\_\_\_ – “we have seen the sons of the Anakims there”

#### **III. Doubt** – “you did not believe the Lord your God” (vs. 30-33)

*Doubting the privilege of God’s:*

- A. **Pro** \_\_\_\_\_ - “goes before you, He shall fight for you”
- B. **Pro** \_\_\_\_\_ – “that the Lord thy God bare thee, as...his son”
- C. **Pre** \_\_\_\_\_ – “a place to pitch your tents in fire by night”

11. What do you think God hated most about their rebellion? (hint v. 34)
12. How can we overcome the temptation to rebel against God?
