- C. C\_\_\_\_\_ "the younger as sisters, with all purity"

II. Respect – "show piety at home" (vs. 3-4)

Honoring with:

- *B. Re\_\_\_\_\_\_* "requite their parents"
- *C. R*\_\_\_\_\_– "good and acceptable before God"

**III. R**esponsibility –" if any provide not for his own" (vs. 5-8) *Taking care of the:* 

- A. Des\_\_\_\_\_\_ "she that is a widow indeed, and desolate"
- **B. De**\_\_\_\_\_\_-"trusts in God"

*C. D\_\_\_\_\_\_ – "continues in supplications and prayers"*
