## God's Word is:

I. Precious – "my…persecutions, afflictions" (vs. 10-11)

Because it:

A. Re\_\_\_\_\_ – "thou hast fully known my doctrine"

B. Re\_\_\_\_\_-"manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, charity"

C. Re\_\_\_\_\_\_ - "but out of them all the Lord delivered me"

**II. Persecuted** – "what persecutions I endured" (vs. 11-13) Because some people are:

A. Det\_\_\_\_\_ – "live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution"

C. Dep\_\_\_\_\_\_ – "seducers shall wax worse and worse"

III. Practical – "all scripture is...profitable"(vs. 14-17)Because it's for our:

A. Lea\_\_\_\_\_ – "things which thou hast learned...been assured of"

**B.** *Le*\_\_\_\_\_ – "to make you wise unto salvation through faith"

C. L\_\_\_\_\_ – "thoroughly furnished unto all good works"
